



President's Report 2008-2009

VICTOR ISAACS

he Australian Association of Timetable Collectors had a very successful year in the sense that all of our established activities operated well. Our measure of success is the level of membership renewals, and this was high, indicating that members are happy.

The main activities that members have contact with are our two magazines and the Distribution service. The magazines are the Times (timetable history and analysis) (editor: Geoff Lambert) and Table Talk (timetable news) (joint editors Victor Isaacs and Geoff Mann). Both maintained a very creditable flow of interesting articles, and both appeared on time every time.

Editing the magazines is one thing, but they then have to be printed and posted. These onerous tasks were expertly continued, without complaint, by Geoff and Judy Lambert.

The Distribution Service is a very valued – and unique – service providing great benefits to members by way of facilitating the acquisition of all manner of timetables and other transport paper. Len Regan continues to fulfil this heavy task very capably, assisted by Hilaire Fraser and Roger Wheaton.

Members in the main cities, (in membership order), Melbourne, Sydney, Brisbane, Canberra and Adelaide, benefited from regular meetings. Each city continued its own style of meeting.

Our website is one of our great strengths, attracting an average of many hits daily. Many will be people seeking general timetable information – but it is all good for the cause. Credit is due to our webmaster, Lourie Smit.

Two auctions were conducted during the year. These entail a heavy workload. The results indicate that they are greatly valued by members as a means of obtaining desired items. They are also one of our major sources of income. Our thanks go to Stephen Ward for shouldering this load.

Negotiations continued, albeit at a slow pace, with the State Library of Victoria, about the establishment of a national timetable collection. We are very grateful that the SLV has agreed to consider hosting this. It has the potential of being an important long-term asset.

The Committee usually meets every three months. Committee members reside in six cities. Hence, we meet by means of a phone hook-up, for which we are grateful to the generosity of Geoff Lambert. One of the joys of the AATTC at present is the harmonious working of the Committee.

The administration of the Association continues. Behind the scenes, all-important tasks are quietly and efficiently carried out by the Secretary, Geoff Lambert, Treasurer, Len Regan and Membership Officer, Dennis McLean.

Most people with an interest in timetables in Australia have probably already joined, (or know of us and have decided not to). Given the very specialised nature of our interest, we now recognise that we will not grow much further. This may have long term implications for sustaining our range of activities. Our new Publicity Officer, Ian Cooper, very capably filled a gap by producing a publicity brochure, after many years without one. We await results, but realistically accept that, even with this, our membership may not increase much beyond our present figure of about 150.





Treasurer's Report, 2008-2009

LEN REGAN

The Financial Statement shows that, on an accrual basis, AATTC made a loss in 2008/09 of \$65.72.

This is the data in the top set of figures in the Financial Statement.

The middle set of figures is the reconciliation of this result with the cash at bank.

The Balance Sheet is at the bottom of the Financial Statement. It shows how much funds we have: \$16 280.00 – an increase of \$1339 over the previous year.

The Financial Statement also shows the financial details for the previous two financial years.

The Comparative Financial Statement shows how each financial activity has contributed to the end-of-year result. In 2008-09:

Members services: loss of \$2352 Distribution Service: loss of \$50

Auction: profit of \$2337 – hence the importance of the Auctions.

During the year:

Direct deposit facilities were established so that payments for Membership, Distribution Service and Auctions can be made direct to the AATTC bank account. This facility has already been used extensively.

An account was established with Australia Post. It can be used by the Production Manager, Distribution Officer and Assistant Distribution Officers to purchase postal services, postal items and stationery. It reduces considerably the need to reimburse personal expenses.

able Talk, the news magazine of the AATTC, operated successfully under the combined editorship of Victor Isaacs and Geoff Mann. Victor looks after Rail and Tram, Air and Ferry sections and Geoff edits the Bus news.

Issues during the year totalled 192 pages. (Depending on pagination, the Members' Newsletter was either attached to Table Talk or appeared as a stand alone item). Table Talk is not a fixed number of pages, but varies according to news and articles availability – issues ranged from 12 to 20 pages. The pagination of one issue (February) went awry due to mistakes by the printer and (to a lesser extent) the compiling editor, Victor. However, the printer accepted responsibility and reprinted the issue at no cost to the AATTC for re-distribution to members.

Both editors are very gratified (and a bit surprised) at how much timetable news is available each month. Thanks are due, in particular, to Tony Bailey and Lourie Smit, for keeping us well supplied with news. We do need your help in sending in news, please.



"the Mixture, as before" is yet again message in these numbers. The proportion of articles that is rail-related is down, after having risen last year. The proportion of pages devoted to Australian issues has increased slightly. Fewer than one-quarter of members have indicated on their application forms that they are interested in Australian timetables only, so our mix would still seem to be satisfactory on this measure.




I am particularly grateful to Dean Ogle, of Custer, WA, for his assiduous post-printing "proof-reading". His input has kept me on my toes.

Production Manager's Report 2008-2009

Production of the AATTC's material—The Times, Table Talk, the Auction catalogues, Members Newsletter, survey forms, the Distribution List and miscellaneous printed guff—ran smoothly all year this year.

It should be noted that most AATTC material is prepared in full colour, but the printers are instructed to make the production in black and white. Further, AATTC printed material is produced by what is essentially a photocopy process, which holds prices down. Full colour, but lower-resolution, versions are available on the AATTC web-site after a prudent period. Some years ago, the Committee approved in principal the printing of one issue per year in full colour but, to date, a suitable edition has not presented itself. The December 2007 edition was, however, produced with a colour cover.

All AATTC production is now done electronically and source material is sent to the Production Manager via email. Material is submitted to the printer on CD-ROM. There is thus no particular reason why the Production Manager cannot be anywhere in Australia, though it is an advantage to have them located in a city which would minimise postage costs— which would probably favour Melbourne. Melbourne, however, did the production for about 20 years, so it would be fair to retain production in Sydney for the moment. It is probably an advantage for the Production Manager and one of the Editors to be the same person.

In past years, a detailed breakdown of production costs and mailing costs was given on this page. This is no longer possible or necessary, because AATTC has established accounts with our printers and with Australia post. All billing details now go directly to the Treasurer, rather than passing through the Production Manager. Bills are also paid by the Treasurer, rather than by the Production Manager. These details can be found in the Financial Statement.

I would like to thank all those who helped with production, including Victor Isaacs and Judy Lambert, to whom we owe a special debt—for it is she who must face *Mr Grumpy* at Australia Post on the first Monday of every month.



Distribution Officer's Report 2008-2009

The Distribution Service produced 12 Distribution Lists during the year, one for each month.

The table below summarises the main performance data for the year, and shows comparisons with previous years. In summary, the Distribution Service continued to perform strongly, but some of the performance characteristics differed from previous years due to the nature of items offered.

While the average value of the orders supplied increased 6%, the average price paid per item fell by 9% in response to a larger number of smaller value items being offered. However the average number of items requested per order increased by 16%. A smaller number of people participated in the Distribution Service.

As in previous years, the difficulties of obtaining sufficient supplies of popular items still remain. Most operators are cooperative, but problems occur when superseded timetables are sent in response to our request for the current timetables.

The number of requests for sets of current timetables is increasing. Some success is being achieved in obtaining bulk supplies of sets of new timetables direct from the operators, with the orders being despatched by an assistant Distribution Officer in the same city.

The most popular item for the year was Item 23 in the December 08 Distribution List: Timetables on DVD 23, for which 24 orders were received. Three Timetables on CD were offered during the year.

In addition to the Distribution List, the Distribution Service continued to provide Grab Box material for the Sydney and Brisbane Division Meetings, and to collect material from the Sydney Grab Box for inclusion in the Distribution Lists.

Financially, the Distribution Service made a small loss for the year of \$50.52. This means it just missed meeting its budget target to breakeven. This result includes the costs of printing the Distribution List. The Financial Statement for the Distribution Service, and comparisons with previous years, is attached.

The Distribution Service holds \$718 in credit for payments for orders that have been made in advance. This is a reduction of \$146 from the amount held in credit at the end of the previous year.

Postage stamps still remain an integral part of the Distribution List trading. 12% of payments were made with stamps, comprising 10% of the value of payments. Stamp trading is kept outside the AATTC accounts. The asset value of stamps held at the end of the year increased by \$27.05 to \$126.35.

Increases in postage costs continue to have an impact on Distribution Service costs. Australia Post increased postage for letters and parcels (items weighing more than 500g) in September 2008. Where possible, large Distribution List orders are posted in multiple 500g letter envelopes, unless individual items weigh more than 500g, or the total weight of the order is more than 2kg.

The task of maintaining the current standards of the Distribution Service is becoming more difficult, and alternatives are being examined, including additional ways of providing support, curtailing some services and possibly reducing some standards.

The success of the Distribution Service would not be possible without the consistent and regular contributions from the supporters who are listed each month in the Distribution Lists. The Assistant Distribution Officers, Hilaire Fraser, Roger Wheaton, Geoffrey Clifton and Joe Friedman, collect and despatch orders for items from their home city. Hilaire also assists greatly by researching new timetables and sending requests for them to operators. Other members who regularly supply material deserve special mention: John Mikita, Lourie Smit, Stephen Gray, Geoff Lambert, Peter Walhouse, Victor Isaacs, Scott Ferris, Steven Haby, Michael Marshall, Matthew Jennings, James Ng, Samuel Rachdi, Spencer Ross and S. Aalbers.

Publicity Officer's Report 2008-2009

• The highlight of the year was the production and distribution in the first few months of 2009 of a high quality brochure "Introducing the Australian Association of Timetable Collectors". Aimed at publicising the AATTC through kindred societies and associations and commercial outlets such as transport bookshops and model railway shops, over 600 copies of the DL-sized brochure was distributed to 48 organisations and businesses in all states, in addition to AATTC Divisions.

What has been the response from potential members?

The answer can best be structured by incorporating the words of Derek Scrafton's prediction, as contained in his response of 15 January 2009 to the proposal to produce such a brochure:

"I think it is a good idea to spread the word amongst the enthusiast fraternity, but I guess the specific interest in timetables will always be confined to a comparatively small number."

While the Publicity Officer has received a few telephone enquiries, seeking specific information about the availability of both historic and current timetables, none of the calls have been translated into additional members.

Regrettably, the potentially valuable publicity which could have been generated as a result of the recent publication in The Sydney Morning Herald and The Age, of an interview with the AATTC Secretary, also failed to generate new members. Derek's assessment has been correct, for 2009, at least! One can now conclude that the Association may well have reached a peak in member numbers.

The AATTC records its appreciation of the significant contribution made by John Mikita of Transit Graphics towards the total cost of the production of the brochure.

Student Members 2




Sydney
