



Although dated 1st July 1997, the T.T. illustrated above and on our pages two and three is still the current Murton's City Bus T.T. for Broken Hill. Perhaps the fact that the T.T. shows section points but not fares indicates that the publishers expected it to have a long life.

Broken Hill has four bus routes, all of which are either circular or 'Q' shaped. The few Saturday morning services see amalgamations of Routes 591/593 and 590/592. Minibuses appear to operate all route services but Murton's school runs (not shown in the T.T.) use full-size vehicles.

MURTONS BROKEN HILL. Continued.

The map that appears in the T.T. is illustrated at the top of our page two. The words "see inset" appear on this map over the city centre but don't bother looking for the inset. The map is actually based on a Gregory's A3 tourist map and the latter does have that elusive inset but not the map in the T.T.

For comparison, a second map showing Broken Hill's steam tram network at its greatest extent is also included at the foot of our page two. This extensive system served the citizens of Broken Hill from 1902 until 1926. The small spur line along Iodide St actually led to the N.S.W.G.R.station which is slightly ironic because passengers wanting to use what was then Broken Hill's main station, S.T.C.'s Suphide Street station, had to walk a few blocks from the tram but trams did pass Railwaytown and trains to/from Adelaide did stop there if required, although this was not shown in most railway T.T.s.

FOOTNOTE ON RAILWAYTOWN:

The suburb of Hillside (destination for Route 593) was originally known as Railway-town and was formerly home to both the pre-1970 Silverton Tramway Co. yards and workshops and to the tram car barn. The latter, now the site of holiday units, was on the south side of Wills St, to the immediate east of the Ambulance Station (the latter shown on the map). In the mid-1970s the Westside Plaza shopping centre, now Broken Hill's major shopping precinct, was built on the former S.T.C. site.

Sadly, it appears that the name, Railwaytown, is being written out of the Broken Hill lexicon and will soon be consigned to the history books. When the shopping centre was first planned, it is believed that it was to be known as Railwaytown Plaza but that was not to be. When Westside Plaza opened, it contained a nice display of photos of the former S.T.C. infrastructure but all that now remains are a few pictures in the centre management office, hidden from public view.

If one refers to the Murton's T.T., one will note that the suburb is referred to seven times: five as "Hillside"; once as "Hillside (Railwaytown)" and once as "HILLSIDE (Railwaytown)".

The former Railwaytown P.O. has been moved to the shopping centre and is now Westside Plaza P.O.

The only remaining official use of the name Railwaytown is at the Railwaytown Primary School but look in the local phone book and not one Railwaytown entry will be found!

JUNK MAIL

T.T. information turns up in unlikely places at times and domestic junk mail is definitely one of them. During May 2003, a leaflet headed <u>AIRPORT BUS EASTSIDE</u> was distributed to households in Boronia and neighbouring areas of eastern Melbourne.

The black and grey on white A5 leaflet, a copy of which appears on our page five, is essentially a T.T. and fare brochure. The times (or, more accurately, lack of them) are interesting in that the only ones given are the arrival times at the destination, ie. Melbourne Airport. For journeys to the airport there are NO departure times from the originating point (Belgrave) or for any of the intermediate boarding places of which 15 are mentioned. No precise details of the location of the bus stops are given either, although the bus will pick one up at street addresses in selected areas so this might not be a serious problem, provided you're in one of these unspecified areas.

Let's keep potential passengers guessing about where and when the buses run - quite a novel idea really!

The fare structure is interesting, too. The second adult travelling for only an extra \$10 is probably designed to make the service somewhat competitive with taxis. However, what do three (or more) adults travelling together pay?

There are other problems with omissions from the leaflet:

- there is no indication that services are provided from Melbourne Airport!
- what are the public holiday services?
- are there child, student and/or concessions fares on this service?
- there is no date (surprise, surprise!)
- the phone number given for talking to a real person is not listed in the phone book which only gives the mobile number and a 1300 number.

Well, it seemed like a good idea at the time \dots .

CURRANT RAISININGS ON THE GRAPEVINE

GENERAL

BOOST FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORT FROM UNEXPECTED SOURCE. Insurance company, I.A.G., announced on 16th July 2003 that it was seriously considering introducing reduced car insurance rates for car drivers who use public transport on a regular basis. A trial scheme could be set up in Queensland. (Southern Cross Radio News)

Queensland

UPDATE - NORTH-WEST QUEENSLAND BUSES. Following the bankruptcy of Coral Coaches some months ago, services in north-western Queensland were closed by at least June 2003. Rail passengers were affected as Coral provided public transport connections between Mount Isa/Cloncurry (Inlander) and Normanton (Gulflander) as well as between Croydon

CURRANT RAISININGS ON THE GRAPE VINE. General. Continued.

(<u>Gulflander</u>) and Georgetown (where connections were made by car for Forsayth and the <u>Savannahlander</u>). In lieu, in early July 2003, Q.R. commenced a bus service in the form of a tour, commencing from Cairns, connecting with the <u>Gulflander</u>, including visits to a number of tourist-oriented sites and concluding by connecting with the <u>Savannahlander</u>. This service forces passengers to spend either two nights in Normanton or one night up the road at Karumba and the second night in Normanton. The T.T. is: Cairns 0630 Monday, Normanton ?? Monday evening, Karumba ?? Monday evening-0730 Tuesday / Normanton-Croydon by <u>Gulflander</u> / Croydon ?? Thursday, Forsayth ?? Thursday evening, Cobbold Gorge ?? Thursday evening (choice of accommodation at Forsayth or Cobbold Gorge), Undara Lava Tubes ?? Friday, Mount Surprise ?? Friday evening / connection with <u>Savannahlander</u> to Cairns. The bus contractor(s) operating on behalf of Q.R. are not known at this stage. (Andrew Hinde, Sunshine Express)

SMS MESSAGES. TransAdelaide recently began providing a mobile phone SMS messaging service to keep passengers informed of service changes and delays in near-real time.

Greater Sydney

BUSTITUTION. The weekend of 21st/22nd June 2003 saw the total closure of the City Circle with buses replacing all services. (Lourie Smit)

UPDATE - TRACKWORK ZONES. The S.R.A.(CityRail) website now contains a list of trackwork dates for the period 1st June 2003-30th June 2004. This is based on the new, larger zones (see last month's <u>Table Talk</u>) for which trackwork will be carried out and, for instance, the Illawarra line will only have work done on four or five occasions instead of the former, greater number of times. However, under the new system, larger parts of the network will be done at any one time, eg. work at Bondi and Cronulla (which have through trains) will be coordinated). Sadly, a lack of planning means that Cronulla passengers suffer on the last weekend of the old system and the first of the new. Nevertheless, under the new arrangements, some buses will operate from Cronulla, stopping Caringbah and then direct to Central. BONDI JUNCTION TURNBACK. \$11 million was allocated in the 2003/04 N.S.W. State Budget, handed down on 24th June 2003, for a new railway turnback at Bondi Junction. This will permit 20 trains per hour on the Eastern Suburbs-Illawarra lines instead of the present 14 per hour.

NEW SOUTH COAST TIMETABLE. A new South Coast line T.T. was issued with the date: "Effective from 18 November 2001, reprinted July 2003". (Michael Marshall)

WILL EPPING-PARRAMATTA BE BUILT? N.S.W.'s new Transport Minister, The Hon. Michael Costa, seems to be reviewing all transport projects and in June 2003 said that the Epping-Parramatta extension of the Chatswood-Epping railway was "currently being assessed". He said investigations would be made to ascertain whether there was a need for the extension or whether the money could be better spent elsewhere. A decision is expected to be made later this year. (The Chatswood-Epping railway is currently under construction.)

QUEEN'S BIRTHDAY DISRUPTIONS. The North Coast line Strathfield-Newcastle/Dungog/Scone was closed for maintenance-related trackwork on the long-weekend 7th-9th June 2003, with buses replacing trains. This was one of the longest stretches of track to have ever been closed at one time and a much larger area was actually affected - as far away as Brisbane - as S.R.A. (CountryLink) services normally using the closed section were also replaced by buses.

Melbourne

ONE MELBOURNE SUBURBAN RAIL COMPANY. The Victorian Government has announced that it will enter into direct negotiations with Connex Trains with the aim of reaching an agreement for the company to run a unified Melbourne train franchise, to be called Trainco, and which will be created by combining the current Connex and M Train businesses. (The latter is presently in receivership after National Express departed from the Australian rail market.) The Government has stated that it now prefers to have suburban rail operations under unified control and also seems set to do the same with the two tram companies. The Government has made it clear that its preference is to negotiate with the incumbent operator but, if negotiations fail, it still retains the option to re-tender the Connex business. (Transit Australia)

Brisbane

STAFF INCREASES. These days most news about staff at railway stations is about decreases. Therefore, it's good to get news of staff increases at Q.R. (Citytrain) stations. Seven stations will be converted from part-time to full-time for a 12 month trial. Q.R. have not announced which stations are involved but it is believed that Ebbw Vale, North Boondall and Moorooka are on the list. (Courier-Mail, S.E.)

UPDATE - NEW TIMETABLES. Many of the ten Brisbane T.T. booklets which were last issued in this form dated 7th May 2001 have been reissued in fold-out format 10x12 cm but still dated 7th May 2001. Nine of the 10 T.T.s have again been reissued in the fold-out format dated 2nd June 2003. The 7th May 2001 fold-out T.T. for the tenth line, Brisbane Airport (formerly just Airport) is still current. The former Ipswich T.T. is now called Ispwich-Rosewood and now contains Trainlink bus T.T.s to Uni. of Qld's Ipswich campus, along with the Route 104 (Princess Alexandra Hospital-Yeronga-Yeerongpilly-Corinda Trainlink T.T. The Princess Alexandra Hospital-Yeronga-Yeerongpilly-Corinda table is also found in the Beenleigh T.T. (However, for the full Uni. of Qld Ipswich campus service, reference must be made to the T.T. issued by Westside Bus Co.) The Sunshine Coast T.T. now contains the Maroochydore Trainlink service as well as the Gympie Q.R. (Citytrain) Courtesy Bus. The current Citytrain Fares and Helpful Hints brochure is undated but does include fares as from 2nd July 2001.

ON TOP OF OLD RAIL LINE. The Queensland Government has approved the sale of the airspace between South Brisbane and South Bank stations to developer, Mirvac, who will extend its office buildings over the space. Part of the Brisbane Convention Centre already extends over the tracks, just south of South Brisbane station. $(\underline{R.D.})$

Perth

TRACK DEVIATION. The W.A.G.R.C. called for tenders, closing 16th June 2003, for the deviation of track Victoria Park-Carlisle to allow for the construction of the Miller/Roberts Rds overbridge and Howick St footbridge. The work will see the lowering of the line and the closure of the existing level crossing near the present Victoria Park station. (David Whiteford)

EARLIER CONSTRUCTION DATE FOR SOUTH PERTH STATION? The sale of W.A. Government land along the Canning Hwy could fund the earlier construction of the South Perth railway station, part of the South West Metropolitan (Mandurah) Project. Present plans call for the station to be built in 2009-10. (David Whiteford)

BASSENDEAN UPGRADE. Work commenced in early June 2003 on a \$5.5 million upgrade of Bassendean station on the Midland line. (Railway Digest)

<u>Asia</u>

COLOMBO TRANSIT? The Sri Lanka Ministry of Western Region Development has called for expressions of interest in building a Metro heavy-rail rapid transit system in Colombo.

New Zealand

UPDATE - NEW STATION AND NEW TIMETABLES FROM AUCKLAND. The last Auckland T.T. brochures showing the Beach Rd terminal (that is, the former Auckland terminal) were issued on 9th June 2003. Public services to the Britomart commenced on 7th July 2003 and the station was officially opened on 25th July 2003. The station has five platforms: island platforms 1 & 2 and 4 & 5 are earmaked for suburban services; single-faced platform 3 will be mainly used by Tranz Scenic services. New T.T. brochures for services to/from Britomart have also been issued. The last Mon-Fri departures are now at about 2000 rather than the former 1830 and there also a number of additional trains during the day. The former Auckland terminal is now being shown in T.T.s as The Strand and no trains are tabled to stop there - they are shown in the T.T. as "TBA". (Rails, etc)

R.I.C. WORKING TIMETABLES. A new, complete Standard W.T.T. was issued by R.I.C. on 31st March 2003 and contained many amendments to train operations. Some were minor, such as slight adjustments to the lengths of freight trains but there were major changes on the Main North line, particularly a rearrangement of the points of termination of coal services from Muswellbrook to Antienne. However, by 4th April 2003 R.I.C. had already issued Amendment No.3 to this W.T.T. It is not known what was in Nos. 1 & 2 but No.3 (STN0633/2003) was some 80 pages of amendments to the South and North Coast lines, mostly the former. Many trains in the four-day-old S.W.T.T. were cancelled and replaced with others, new trains were inserted and a number of others deleted altogether. There was also a major rearrangement of F.A. services on the Main South.

A feature of the W.T.T.s produced since the buy-out of FreightRail and the N.R.C. by PacNat has been the persistence of the names of the former entities in T.T.s. The reason is not clear. F.A. trains are identified by the heading FAUST - they appear to have struck some sort of bargain with R.I.C.

Commencing with STN0633/2003, the S.W.T.T. and associated S.T.N.s will be available in both electronic and paper form. STN0633 contained a survey form asking users to express a preference for one or the other or both. R.I.C. already makes many of its working documents available to employees and users on the web but the S.W.T.T. has not yet appeared there. (Geoff Lambert)

S.R.A. (CountryLink)/Rail Access Corporation

MANY LINES RECOMMENDED FOR CLOSURE. Table Talk does not often report on recommendedations before they begin to take on some reality but the following is reported
because of the far-reaching effects it may have and, importantly, because of the
political clout of the organisation making the recommendation. A recent report
compiled by the N.S.W. Grain Advisory Committee recommends closure of a number of
grain-belt branch lines, totalling at least 300 km of track. The Yanco-Wilbriggie
(formerly Hay), Wyalong-Lake Cargelligo/Burcher and Merrygoen-Gwabegar lines are
listed as top candidates for closure. Other possible closures are The Rock-Boree
Creek, Griffith-Hillston, Barmedman-Rankin Springs, Bogan Gate-Tottenham and MoreeWeemelah. The report states that in the case of low-tonnage lines it may be more
economical to improve local road networks than spend money on upgrading branch lines.

TRUNCATED BRISBANE XPT. Construction of the Inner North Busway under the western approach to Roma Street Transit Centre forced the Brisbane XPT to terminate at the dual gauge platform at Park Road, on 17th May 2003. In a joint S.R.A. (CountryLink)/Q.R. operation, passengers and luggage were transferred to a six-car IMU so as to continue to Roma Street. The XPT proceeded empty to South Brisbane where it was stabled on the standard gauge-only section of track. Reverse operations occurred for Up passengers. (A.R.H.S. Bulletin)

WHEELCHAIR ACCESSIBLE BUSES. As from May 2003 contractors of S.R.A.(CountryLink) bus services have been progressively phasing in the use of wheelchair accessible buses on these routes.

CANBERRA-SNOWY MOUNTAINS. Alpinexpress, a new partnership between S.R.A.(Country-Link) and Transborder Express commenced on 28th June 2003 when Transborder began a service that connects off the morning Xplorer at Canberra and runs to Jindabyne, returning to connect with the late afternoon train to Sydney. The bus will operate daily until 26th September 2003, when it will run Tue, Thu, Sat only until 24th June 2004 when a daily service is expected to recommence. (Ian Cooper)

YASS-CANBERRA BUSES. As from 30th June 2003 there are only two services Yass-Woden, instead of three as formerly. There is only one service from Woden in the afternoon, instead of three. The price of Weekly tickets on this run have been increased by \$2.00 and the 10 Ridesaver ticket now costs \$1.00 more - all other fares remain the same.

SERVICES SUSPENDED ON THREE LINES! F.A. ANNOUNCED ON 3rd JULY 2003 THAT SERVICES HAD BEEN SUSPENDED OVER THE SECTIONS TOOLAMBA-ECHUCA, BARNES-MOULAMEIN and CASTLEMAINE-MARYBOROUGH.

UPDATE - ALBURY BUSES. The replacement buses Wodonga-Albury ran from 10th June-4th July 2003. Journey times were extended by about 20 minutes but Up buses from Albury left 10 minutes before usual train times. An A5 leaflet outlining the changes was issued. (Craig Halsall)

UPDATE - REGIONAL FAST RAIL PROJECT. A number of complete line shutdowns are expected while work is done on the Regional Fast Rail Project. There will be a 30 day closure of the line Werribee-South Geelong in January 2004. All services will be replaced by buses but it is not yet certain whether they will run from Spencer Street, connect with suburban trains at Werribee or whether an express V/Line Passenger service will be provided on the direct line Spencer Street-Werribee.

Following the conversion of the Central Line beyond Emerald to Direct Traffic Control instead of Train Order Working in mid-April 2003, a number of sidings on the main line and branches are being closed. This includes the closure of the angles (triangles/wyes) at Dillcar and Emmet. (Sunshine Express)

NEW <u>WESTLANDER TIMETABLE</u>. <u>Westlander</u> T.T. No.27, effective 31st May 2003, was issued. Times have been slowed somewhat (see our page 10 for the actual times). The new T.T. also shows that the <u>Westlander</u> now arrives at Roma Street Platform 10 (it departs from Platform 2 as previously). (Gavin Young)

UPDATE - NEW TIMETABLES. Concurrent with the introduction of the Cairns tilt train and the publishing of new T.T.s dated 16th June 2003, the following T.T.s, not yet listed, have been sighted: the Whitsunday Transit coordinated bus Proserpine-Airlie Beach/Shute Harbour - this service now meets tilt trains; a new 10 page attractive, full-colour brochure folding down to 100x210 mm was also issued. Unlike the summary brochures which do not show any intermediate times, the latter T.T., Timetable for Traveltrain Holidays Queensland is more than a holiday brochure, in fact it is the nearest to a Traveltrain system-wide T.T. to be issued since 1990. It includes full T.T.s and fares from Brisbane for all services except the Savannahlander which is now run for Q.R. by a contractor. This most attractive brochure contains a full colour map. WORKING TIMETABLE. A new Q.R. (Traveltrain) W.T.T. was issued dated 14th June 2003, to coincide with the introduction of the Cairns tilt train. It is unusual for a W.T.T. in that it is a 'souvenir edition' highlighting the 50th anniversary of 'Lander' trains. The W.T.T. incorrectly shows the eastbound <u>Inlander</u> as arriving at Townsville at 1245 (as do some other public brochures) whereas the correct time is 1310, as shown in <u>Timetable for Traveltrain Holidays Queensland</u> (see our page 10).

MISSED CONNECTION. It should be noted that the northbound Cairns tilt train leaves Townsville five minutes before the arrival of the <u>Inlander</u> thus missing a good opportunity for a connection. This is similar to N.S.W.'s Down Xplorer to Griffith which is timed to wait at the Down Junee distant signal until the Up Melbourne XPT has passed, again missing an ideal connection and made worse by the fact that former T.T.s did cater for a Melbourne-Griffith connection at Junee. EXTENDED SUNLANDERS. Nine of the Townsville Sunlander services during July and September 2003 school holidays will be extended to Cairns. (Thomas Cook O'seas T.T.)

UPDATE - NEW TOWNSVILLE STATION. The last regular services to use the old Townsville station were the Up and Down Cairns services on 26th May 2003. Concurrently, the new station was being cut in and was ready for use by the Down <u>Sunlander/Queenslander</u> on the following day, 27th May 2003. Strangely, buses replaced trains Townsville-Cairns on the following day, 28th May, as track signalling work was still being completed.

NEW BALLOON LOOP. Barney Point, Gladstone, unloading point for the Moura Mine-Barney Point Moura Direct line, was recently provided with a balloon loop connecting the Provisioning Shed and the coal pit. NEW TRAVEL MAGAZINE. Following the trend set by S.R.A.(CountryLink), G.S.R., and, earlier, the airlines, Q.R. is now providing all sleeping berth and tilt train passengers with a complimentary Q.R. travel magazine. The first edition is endorsed "Autumn 2003". (Sunshine Express)

ACACIA RIDGE YARDS. The Q.R. standard gauge marshalling yards at Acacia Ridge are to be converted by Q.R. into a multi-user facility. In order to achieve this, Q.R. is terminating PacNat's lease of the terminal. (Sunshine Express)

TYPOGRAPHICAL ERROR. The current G.S.R. fare information on Q.R.'s web page shows fares as being "valid 11 April 2003-31 March 2003". Hmm! (Dean Ogle)

WE WERE WRONG - LAST GHAN INTO N.S.W. The report in last month's <u>Table Talk</u> regarding the truncating of the last <u>Ghan</u> into N.S.W. was a little misleading. On 30th March 2003, eastbound passengers were off-loaded at Wallerawang and not Lithgow and taken to Sydney by bus. Meanwhile, the train did travel to Lithgow for servicing and replenishment before returning to Wallerawang to pick up its westbound passengers.

A WAY AROUND INSURANCE DIFFICULTIES. The Yorke Peninsula Rail Preservation Society has come up with an excellent way of overcoming the insurance difficulties that are blighting so many other tourist railways. On 13th April 2003 the Society was officially chartered as the new Lions Club of Yorke Peninsula Rail and, after negotiations with Lions International, is being insured at attractive rates by Lions Insurance. Trips Wallaroo-Kadina recommenced on the same day. (Catchpoint)

NEW TIMETABLES. New W.A. P.T.A. (Transwa) T.T. brochures were issued dated 28th May 2003 and featuring the new Transwa logo (illustrated at left). The <u>Prospector</u> T.T. is orange and that for the <u>Australind</u> in dark blue.

NEW <u>PROSPECTOR</u>. The new <u>Prospector</u> (Perth-Kalgoorlie) services utilising new railcars are expected to commence in late September 2003. (<u>Thomas Cook Overseas Timetable</u>)

DONNYBROOK. The heritage upgrade of Donnybrook railway station commenced on 19th May 2003. (David Whiteford)

UPDATE - SOUTH-WEST TRAIN PASSENGER STUDY. Some of the findings of the South-West train passenger services study (see last month's <u>Table Talk</u>) were recently released. They suggest that the proposal to extend the passenger service Bunbury-Manjimup should be abandoned but that there should be a more detailed analysis of the proposed Bunbury-Busselton extension. The former would cost \$30 million and use existing track and the latter has been costed at \$144 million and would require much new track. The report also provided a range of options for reducing Perth-Bunbury passenger travel times by between one and two hours. (David Whiteford)

Australian Transport Network (Tasrail)

END OF WILTSHIRE SERVICE. As widely expected, freight train running west of Burnie was suspended on 27th March 2003, just a little over four years after the service was reinstated on 29th January 1999 after the line was originally closed on 6th August 1996. The combination of low traffic levels, poor track conditions and problems with several bridges made it uneconomic for Tasrail to continue the service. While it is always sad to see a line closed or suspended, Table Talk applauds A.T.N. for attempting to revive services whereas their predecessors, A.N.R.C., were more than happy to abandon the line.

BELL BAY LINE. Following little use over recent months, the Longreach spur, off the Bell Bay line, was noted bolted over, indicating that the 2 km branch is now effectively 'mothballed'. Up until the recent cessation of Wiltshire traffic (see item above) all pulp logs carried by rail had been delivered to Artec Siding on the branch.

INTERCITY CYCLEWAY. Hobart's Intercity Cycleway, which is built on the site of the former Down line before the Hobart suburban area was singled by A.N.R.C. in the late 1970s, has always been something of a bugbear to railfans because it severely limits trackside photographic opportunities. In late March 2003 work commenced on extending the Cycleway north from Berriedale towards Chigwell. (Tasmanian Rail News)

Other Tasmania

DERWENT VALLEY RAILWAY EXTENSION. After many years of work, D.V.R. ran the first passenger train in eight years on its new extension Westaway-National Park, on 30th March 2003. Special permission was granted for the operation of this train and the resumption of a regular service had to wait until the completion of further track upgrading. However, D.V.R. issued a brochure showing monthly trains to National Park as from 8th June 2003. (Tasmanian Rail News, The Railfan Shop)

Northern Territory

FIRST TRAIN. The inaugural train Alice Springs-Darwin will be a goods train from Adelaide operated by Asia Pacific Transport, the company contracted by the Austral-Asia Railway Corporation to work the line. (A.R.H.S. Bulletin)

New Zealand

GOVERNMENT INPUT INTO TRANZ RAIL. On 6th June 2003 the N.Z. Government signed an agreement to buy back the infrastructure of the rail network for \$1 and to take out a 35% stake in Tranz Rail and rescue it from potential insolvency through an immediate cash injection of NZ\$44 million. Tranz Rail will remain the sole N.Z. rail freight operator. Toll Holdings, who were looking at the purchase of the whole company, have taken a 10% share of Tranz Rail. However, the Government offer is still subject to approval by a majority of Tranz Rail shareholders. (Rails)

North America

AMTRAK TIMETABLES. Most Amtrak T.T.s were reissued dated 28th April 2003.

MEXICAN PASSENGER TRAINS. As at 27th April 2003, the following was the sorry state of passenger services in Mexico:

- the Mexico City-Apizaco service had been suspended, leaving Mexico City's Buenavista station without any passenger trains;
- the former Coatzacoalcos-Campeche service had been truncated to Coatzacoalcos-Palenque;
- the former Coatzacoalcos-Tapachula service had been truncated to Ixtepec-Tapachula;
- the Mérat-Izamal excursion train had been suspended due to lack of State Government subsidies;
- one piece of good news: Zacatecas State has ordered Ferromex to run a weekly passenger train Felipe Pescador-Torreon a lot of towns along the line are not accessible by road. (Rail News Victoria)

South/Central America

EXPANDED PASSENGER SERVICES IN PERU. Ferrocarril Central Andino S.A. hope to expand their Lima-Huancayo service in 2004. (Thomas Cook Overseas Timetable)

PERU: ARICA ON AGAIN, OFF AGAIN. The Tacna-Arica service commenced re-running some months ago, albeit sometimes late, but it is now believed that the service has been stopped again.

SARS IN CHINA. It is understood that the printing of the April/May 2003 edition of the China Railways public T.T. was stopped because of the SARS outbreak.

TANZANIA. The Tanzania Railway service Ruvu-Tanga was recently withdrawn.

TRAMWAY REFRESHMENT ROOMS. The staff canteen at Southbank Depot closed on 30th May 2003. The same operator formerly ran the facility at South Melbourne Depot. Expressions of interest in running the canteen have been sought by Yarra Trams but none have been forthcoming and it looks as if it will not reopen. The Essendon Depot canteen is still open but only serves tea and coffee; Malvern lasted until 2002; Glen Huntly closed many years ago.

FINE TUNING. Services on Route 109 (Box Hill-City-Port Melbourne) have been altered by up to two minutes on account of road congestion. The only place that this is announced appears to be Customer Bulletins on trams - there are no changes to T.T.s, (including those at stops) and nothing on the Yarra Trams website. (Craig Halsall)

Adelaide

BUSTITUTION. TransAdelaide carried out track maintenance at the Victoria Square tram terminus from 2000 on Friday 23rd May until 0000 24th/25th May 2003. Consequently, trams terminated at South Terrace with a free shuttle bus to/from Victoria Square.

SENTOSA IS., SINGAPORE. Expressions of interest have been called to build a tram system on Singapore's tourist island of Sentosa Is. The system will connect the southern shore beaches with the aerial cableway to the Singapore mainland. (R.N.V.)

SUBURBAN BUS

General

N.S.W. BUS REVIEW. The N.S.W. Minister for Transport, The Hon. Michael Costa, announced in early July 2003 that he would be calling a review of all private and government bus operators in the State. Companies will be called on to show that they are meeting minimum standards of service required by law and that taxpayers are getting value for the \$541 million investment. (Illawarra Mercury, Neville Fenn)

Canberra

GUNGAHLIN SERVICES. A \$2.9 million funding boost to bus services to/from Gungahlin was announced in the A.C.T. Budget in May 2003. The four year package includes \$737,000 for 2003/04, which will provide an extra 8900 hours of service in Gungahlin, an 18.2% increase on the last T.T. and 40% since May 2002. The Government's One Fare Anywhere scheme, along with 205 extra services last year, resulted in a 20% increase in patronage on these routes. Services are expected to be extended in Amaroo and Yerrabi Pond in July 2003. Routes through Gungahlin suburbs such as Nicholls will be made more direct. ACTION is expected to introduce a four minute frequency Gungahlin Market Place-City during peaks with buses every 15 minutes off peak. (Transit Aust.)

Sydney

TIMETABLE NUMBERS. All S.T.A. (Sydney Buses and (Newcastle Buses) T.T.s issued since the beginning of March 2003 contain a six digit document number. Six Newcastle T.T.s have a 12xxxx number and all others, including other Newcastle T.T.s, have 17xxxx. With one exception the first five digits of the number are unique and no particular pattern has been noted. The numbers appear on both TransitGraphics and old format T.T.s. (Lourie Smit)

NEW BUS STOP NUMBERING SYSTEM. The Transport Co-ordination Authority is currently implementing a new bus stop numbering system within the S.T.A. (Sydney Buses) network. Small stickers have been placed on bus stops showing the unique stop number. The stop number is being used on the T.C.A. website and customer phone line to help identify the time of the next bus. A DL size leaflet has been published and includes a tear-off credit-card size card which can be used to record the customer's stop number for future use. (Adrian Dessanti)

WOOLLOOMOOLOO DIVERSION. Routes 311, 312 will be diverted from their normal routes at William and Bourke Sts, Woolloomooloo from 6th July 2003 and for about six months, due to construction of the Cross City Tunnel. (Adrian Dessanti)

UPDATE - **SHORELINK TO THORNLEIGH.** The Shorelink Route 589 (Hornsby-Thornleigh) T.T. of 23rd June 2003 has the last Mon-Fri bus now operating to Hornsby-Woodlands only and not shown as returning to Hornsby. (Michael Smith)

SHORELINK TO BARRA HRUI. The current Shorelink Route 582 T.T. shows services extended to Barra Brui only every two hours during Mon-Fri off-peaks and with no service on Sat, Sun, P.H. However, it is believed that, following numerous complaints, drivers have been instructed to go to Barra Brui on request. This appears to be an informal arrangement that is not advertised. (Michael Smith)

SHORELINK TO WESTLEIGH. A new Shorelink Route 587 (Westleigh) T.T. has been effective as from 21st July 2003. There are minor timing changes for Mon-Fri trips and a slight reduction in the number of additional peak trips to/from Pennant Hills. The T.T. also shows Nightride bus times Sydney-Strathfield-Hornsby. (Adrian Dessanti)

TRANSIT FIRST. Westway Bus and Coach Service was renamed Transit First as from 25th June 2003. Concurrently, a new livery was introduced and new T.T.s were introduced for all routes on either 27th or 28th July 2003. (Aust. Transport Discussion Board)

- BUSWAYS NEW ROUTES. As from 14th July 2003, Busways will introduce two new routes:
 - Route 730 (Kellyville Ridge-Westmead-Parramatta) six morning and six afternoon trips from Parramatta;
 - Route 735 (Kellyville Ridge-City via M2 motorway) two morning trips to Railway Square and two afternoon trips from Railway Square.

The two routes are covered in one T.T. in standard Busways format. (Robert Henderson)
