

General News

Commonwealth Games

At the time of press there was little information regarding public transport services offered during the Commonwealth Games. General information about increased tram, train and bus services in designated areas had been posted on the Metlink website. Patrons with tickets to events will travel free and there has been a limited newspaper advertising campaign regarding travelling during the games period. (Steven Haby, *Transit Australia*)

Bus news

Dion's Bus Service and Greens Northern Coaches are planning to work together to obtain a State Government contract for Wollongong bus services. This follows the recent recommendations of a State Government review to reduce the number of contract areas for bus services from the current level of 97 to just 10 in the outer metropolitan area (including the Illawarra). Currently eight contracts are shared between these two companies and Premier Illawarra. (Illawarra Mercury, Neville Fenn)

Railway news

There have been numerous changes in the Australian railway industry. Amongst the highlights are:

- Ownership of the Tasmanian rail track will be returned to the Tasmanian Government, who will be required to set up an Open Access regime, to allow competitors to Pacific National onto the rails. It has been suggested that ARTC might take over this management role
- Toll and Patrick are still at loggerheads over Pacific National and with one another. A split up of Pacific National into two rail operators has been mooted, with one portion becoming a Patrick company. The ACCC has ruled that Toll may not take over Patrick, as this would be anticompetitive for the rail industry.
- Queensland Railways have bought out Westfarmers' share of ARG, comprising the above-rail and below-rail operations in Western Australia and the above-rail operations in South Australia. Genesee & Wyoming retains control of the Open Access track in South Australia.
- The NCC (National Competition Council) will probably recommend to the Government that that BHP-Billiton's rail system in the Pilbara

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be "declared" for Open Access, allowing other rail operators and miners onto its tracks. The

proposed declaration is being appealed (Geoff Lambert)



National

ARTC National

This operator took the unusual step of issuing a new Working Time Table for its entire system on 29 Jan 2006. The timetable was back-dated to take effect from 18 December 2005. Usually ARTC National issues new WTTs only twice a year, in March and September

A new Gawler line TT has been released dated 26 February 2006. (Michael Marshall)

Victoria

Connex

Plans are underway for a third peak hour during the Commonwealth Games with last down departures from Flinders Street as late as 0145. The late night peak service is likely to commence around 2200 following the completion of evening events. Although no timetables have been announced (with the exception of **V/Line**

Passenger as outlined in February's *Table Talk*) it is intended that up to 2200 trains will run every 20 minutes (rather than the current 30 after 1900) and then intensive services will run from 2200 to last services. All services will be six-car sets. (Steven Haby, *Transit Australia*)

V/Line Passenger

New TT for Mildura – Melbourne; Casterton/Hamilton and Swan Hill – Melbourne services have been released both dated 27 February 20056 and are in large pocket size. To incorporate all rather than major stops (Bradley Matthews, Craig Halsall)

Following completion of the works associated with the Regional Fast Rail project full rain services have resumed between Swan Hill – Bendigo – Melbourne from Wednesday 22 February 2006 (it will be interesting to look if patronage levels have changed—editor). The last of the works involved signal testing and driver familiarisation. (Bradley Matthews)

A new Warrnambool TT has been published dated 19 February 2006 incorporating the new Sherwood Park (adjacent to Deakin University's Warrnambool Campus) station. At this stage the 1740 up on Fridays and the 1900 down on Sundays stop at the station (a simple platform with a shelter. Could we see before long a resumption of "suburban" services along the lines of the former service to Dennington west of Warrnambool? – Editor). The TT also shows the retiming of the 1745 up which now runs 5 minutes earlier to Winchelsea then as normal. (Craig Halsall)



Tram/ Light Rail

Melbourne

Yarra Trams has announced the return of William Street services serviced by south eastern tram routes – specifically route 3 (East Malvern) and route 5 (Malvern – Bourke Road). The objective of these changes is to offer a direct service to William Street and to ease congestion at the

University of Melbourne terminus. The following changes, to come into effect possibly at the commencement of the Commonwealth Games, will occur:

- · Route 3 and 5 will be elimated
- New route 33 East Malvern City via William Street off peak, nights and weekends.

- New route 53 East Malvern West Coburg (via William Street and incorporating the Domain Road – West Coburg route 55 service) operating peak hours only
- Extended route 55 West Coburg Domain Road to Malvern – Burke Road.

Essendon and Glen Huntly depots will share operations and the current stub terminus at

Doman Road interchange will be changed to become a loop and connect with St Kilda Road tracks (similar to St Vincents Plaza layout). Interestingly route 3 and 5 are relatively quiet runs with route 5 services operating as a shuttle as part of the 64 to East Brighton for many years during nights. Newcastle Buses

Route 223 and 227 that service the University of Newcastle have been withdrawn. (Lourie Smit)

Links to PDF TT are shown on the site although at the time of press there were none present. The three operations are collectively referred to "Bus Services in the Westlakes Region" on the home page. Victoria—Melbourne

Cranbourne Transit

New Metlink DL sized TT for routes 789, 790, 791 has been published dated February 2006. (Craig Halsall)

Driver Bus Lines

Route 612 Box Hill – Chadstone has been published in Metlink pocket size dated December 2005 to complete the set for this company. (Michael Marshall)

Broadmeadows Bus Service

A new 532 Broadmeadows – Upfield – Craigieburn TT has been updated and has been cut back to terminate at Craigieburn station. New route 533 Craigieburn North – Craigieburn South replaces part of the old 532. Both TT are dated 27 February 2006 and are in standard Metlink DL format. (Bradley Matthews)

National (Ventura)

A number of revisions and enhancements have been made to numerous services. All TT are dated 27 February 2006 and have been issued in standard Metlink pocket sized formats. Routes involved include:

- Routes 200, 203, 205 (TT no. 5)
- Routes 201, 202 and 302 (TT no. 2)
- Routes 207, 307 (TT no. 4)
- Routes 270 and 271 (TT no. 7)
- Routes 313, 315, 316 (TT no. 38)
- Route 366 (TT no. 19)
- Route 367 (TT no. 20)

TT updates are a reflection of changes to patronage and traffic levels on certain roads.

Furthermore train connections are also shown. (Bradley Matthews)

Route 285 reverted to its original route via Mont Albert and Rochester Roads due to improved traffic signalling from 27 February 2006. No TT update was issued. (Craig Halsall)

Northern Buslines

New TT in standard Metlink DL sized format dated 27 February 2006 have been released for routes 534 Merlynston – Glenroy; 536 Gowrie – Glenroy and new route 544 Broadmeadows – Craigieburn which is jointly operated by **Broadmeadows Bus Service**. (Michael Marshall)

A number of service improvements for other routes are to come into effect from March 2006. The changes include:

- Route 540 Broadmeadows Upfield will have extra weekday evening trips from 14 March 2006
- Route 541 Broadmeadows Roxburgh Park will have extra Saturday evening trips from 18 March 2006
- Route 542 Oak Park to Roxburgh Park will have Saturday evening trips from 18 March 2006. (Craig Halsall)

Peninsula Bus Lines

A temporary TT for routes 781, 784 and 785 has been released following withdrawal of former new Metlink TT due to unspecified errors. The TT is undated but came into effect on 30 January 2006. Corrected Metlink style TT are due to be released shortly. (Craig Halsall)

Ventura

Routes 688, 689 and 690 TTs have been published dated 27 February 2006 with the Mt Dandy name removed and full Ventura branding. Route 688 Croydon to Olinda now operates an hourly Sunday service. (Craig Halsall)

Westrans Werribee

A new TT booklet dated 27 February 2006 was released and incorporated a number of route improvements including

- Route 438 Werribee Wyndham Green extended to serve Manor Lakes
- Route 442 Hoppers Crossing to Grange sees some changes to the route which is now served by new route 445
- Route 444 Hoppers Crossing Tarneit loop now sees services run in both directions but

- departures are at around the same time which reduces benefits to passengers.
- New route 445 Werribee Hoppers Crossing via Plaza and incorporates some sections of the 442 in the Grange estate area. Hourly services from 0608 to 1951 weekdays and 0708 to 1851 Saturdays. A relative rarity is that the service has a number of express components. For example one section is express from Hoppers Crossing to Werribee Plaza. Traditionally express bus routes in the greater Melbourne area are the result of running rights over another operator's territory. It will be interesting to see whether this is extended to other services.
- The booklet includes Westrans Altona routes 413 Werribee Plaza to Laverton and 416 Hoppers Crossing to Aircraft. (Michael Marshall, Craig Halsall, Steven Haby)

Brisbane City Council

The following TT in TransLink format all dated 20 February 2006 have been released:

- Routes 193, 195-197, 199
- Routes 344, 345 (the 345 is now a BUZ route)
- Route 367 previously this was released in the CityTrans pocket format and now all off peak services travel via the Great Western Shopping Centre in Keperra.
- Route 393 Bulimba Ferry Bowen Hills QUT – Roma Street - a new cross-town route. (David Hutton)

New TT have come into effect dated 26 February 2006 for the following routes:

- 222 Group for the Go Zone services (Michael Marshall)

Queensland—Country

Brisbane2Byron

A small coach operator that has operated a service between Brisbane and Byron Bay for a couple of years. A new undated TT was collected from Roma Street Interchange in DL card format with a Mitsubishi Rosa bus on the cover.

Services operate each day with departures Mondays to Saturdays at 0800 arriving Byron Bay at 1000. The return service departs at 1100 and arrives at Roma Street at 1300 then the airport at 1330. An afternoon service ex Brisbane operates weekdays and Sundays only departing Brisbane airport at 1215, Roma Street at 1300 then arriving Byron Bay at 1500. The return service departs Byron Bay at 1600 with arrival back in Brisbane at 1800 (Roma Street) and 1830 at the airport.

This operator also has a website at www.brisbane2byron.com. (Steven Haby)

Byron Bay Shuttle

Apparently this is a new operator providing a service between Brisbane, Byron Bay, Ballina and Lismore. An undated DL card TT shows services departing Lismore for Brisbane at 0515, 0725 and 1340 and ex Brisbane at 0945, 1215 and 1800. It is assumed that these services operate daily although no days of operation are shown. Clearly competition for traffic is fierce between this operator, **Brisbane2Byron**, **Greyhound** and other operators. The company also has a website at www.byronbayshuttle.com.au. (Steven Haby)

Qantas & Jetstar

- Services to Hamilton Island will cease for the second time from 26 March 2006. (T. J. Tottenham)
- Brisbane Mackay services will cease from 26 March 2006 and will be replaced with

services operated by **Qantas Link**. Interestingly **Jetstar** have also cancelled their services to Mackay in favour of **Qantas Link**. (T. J. Tottenham)

O'Connor Airlines

 A twice daily Adelaide – Port Augusta service commenced from 13 February 2006. (T. J. Tottenham)

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OzJet

From 14 March 2006 **OzJet** will fly to Perth from Melbourne. A daily 2000 departure ex Melbourne and 2240 ex Perth will be the initial service level. (Tony Bailey)

International

Air Nauru

Further to the January 2006 article in *TT* regarding the possession of this airline's only plane, it is revealed that the airline also, on behalf of **Qantas** operated a weekend Brisbane – Norfolk Island – Sydney – Norfolk Island – Brisbane service. **Jet Connect** (a subsidiary of

Qantas New Zealand) is now providing this weekend service. (T. J. Tottenham)

Qantas

Three additional Brisbane – Auckland services will operate from 29 March 2006 taking the number of flights between the two cities to ten. The new services are operated by Boeing 737-300 aircraft and will enable a morning and evening service on Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays. (Tony Bailey)

Singapore Airlines

Adelaide – Singapore services will now operate daily rather than five times a week. (T. J. Tottenham)

Tasmania

TT-Line (Spirit of Tasmania)

A number of services will be altered during the offseason due to regular maintenance programs for Spirit of Tasmania (SPOT) I, II and III vessels.

SPOT III will operate on the Melbourne – Devonport run from 17 to 28 July, 31 July to 11 August and 14 August to 17 August 2006. SPOT will be then dry-docked on 20 August and resume services on Sunday 27 August 2006. Due to dry-

docking of the other SPOTs the following services will not operate on the Melbourne-Devonport run:

- 16 July sailing ex Melbourne
- 29 July sailing ex Devonport
- 30 July sailing ex Melbourne
- 12 August sailing ex Devonport
- 13 August sailing ex Melbourne

The following services on the Devonport-Sydney run will not operate:

- 22 July sailing ex Devonport
- 23 July sailing ex Sydney
- 5 August sailing ex Devonport
- 6 August sailing ex Sydney
- 20 August sailing ex Sydney
- 26 August sailing ex Devonport

Meanwhile due to healthy patronage figures an extra 14 sailings between Devonport and Sydney have been scheduled throughout 2006 despite continuing losses made by **TT-Line**. (Tony Bailey)
