#### China

#### New China – Tibet railway opens

On 1 July 2006 the new Qinghai – Tibet railway line is due to commence trial operations. China railways have already established the timetables for the first three pairs of trains from five cities to Lhasa. One train T27/8 departs Beijing's West Railway station at 2130 arriving in Tibet at 2058 on day 3 after 4,064km. Overall the trip takes 47 hours and 28 minutes.

The trip from Chengdu, capital of southwest China's Sichuan Province, to Lhasa, with a length of 3,360 kilometres, will take about 48 hours and 10 minutes by the trains T22/23, while the return journey by the train T24/1 will be 48 hours 50 minutes. This train will pass Guangyuan, Baoji, then link to Lanzhou, Xining, Golmud and Nagqu township before it reaches Lhasa.

Now the world's highest railway, the line extends 1,956 kilometres from Xining to Lhasa. Some 960 kilometres of its tracks are 4,000 meters above sea level and the highest point is 5,072 meters, at least 200 meters higher than the Peruvian railway in the Andes, which was formerly the world's highest altitude railway. #### India

#### Timetables speeded up and other reforms

A new rationalized railway time table will be introduced with effect from 1st July 2006. The new TT has resulted in speeding up of 140 trains, which have now been made *superfast* (Indian Railways term) in the first phase. The time taken for the journey will be reduced by one hour for 85 trains, by 60-120 minutes for 31 trains, by 120-300 minutes for 16 trains and more than 300 minutes for 8 trains. 34 mail/express trains have also been speeded up by 90 to 435 minutes. 2422 and 2444 New Delhi-Bhubaneshwar Rajdhani has been speeded up by 80 minutes.

This year, the time table will be published in two phases i.e. one effective from 1 July 2006 and the other from 1 December 2006 due to large scale revision of the existing time table.

Meanwhile many trains have now been strengthened with additional carriages and new maintenance programs have been introduced, including converting all stock to air-brake operation. (Tony Bailey)

An article in the Adelaide Advertiser on 30 June 2006 reported that Torrens Transit is undertaking a comprehensive review of their route services and that at least 30 of their 150 routes operated are targeted to be axed according to a draft plan. These include services in and out of major areas such as Marion, Flinders University and Arndale Shopping Centre at Kilkenny. The proposals are yet to be signed off by the SA Transport Minister. #### QantasLink

#### **Route rationalisation**

Qantas has announced changes to its Northern Tasmania and South Australia schedules, following a review of the regional QantasLink network. The plan includes the following service reducations:

- cease operations to its two South Australian ports, Kangaroo Island and Port Lincoln from 28 June 2006;
- cease operation to Burnie in Tasmania on 31 July 2006;
- replace daily Qantas B737 Launceston-Melbourne services with double daily Dash 8 services on 1 August 2006 and
- maintain Jetstar's 21 A320 jet return services a week between Launceston and Melbourne. (Tony Bailey)

#### Rex

#### **Rex ceases Armidale services**

From 2 July 2006 Rex will cease their Sydney to Armidale service due to low patronage. (Tony Bailey)

#### **Rex expands services to Port Lincoln**

From 17 July 2006 Rex will add four flights per week from Adelaide and three further return services from 14 August 2006. This follows the cancellation of all flights to Port Lincoln operated by QantasLink from 28 June 2006. (Tony Bailey)

#### **SPOT III ceases**

On 27 August 2006 *Spirit of Tasmania III* will make its last trip between Sydney and Devonport before being sold and the service cancelled due to lower than expected patronage and high costs. Meanwhile press reports in the Melbourne *Age* 

#### More Wagga Wagga flights

From 3 July 2006 Rex will increase flights to Wagga Wagga from Sydney with the introduction of number of additional services in peak times. An extra morning flight will depart Sydney at 0640 and Wagga Wagga at 0810 and additional evening flights from Wagga Wagga at 1830 and Sydney at 1700. (Tony Bailey)

#### **Qatar Airways**

#### Daily flights to Australia plan

Qatar Airways is in negotiation with the government to introduce

daily flights to Australia. Talks have begun over the plan to launch the services between Doha and Australian ports.

The airline is looking to come online in Australia early in 2007 but is awaiting approval from the Australian government for daily access.

It is believed the carrier is pushing for the daily flights as any fewer would not make the route viable. The airline currently operates offline for Australian passengers through Singapore, Bangkok, Kuala Lumpur and Hong Kong to the Middle East, Africa and Europe (Tony Bailey)

newspaper and ABC News Online on Tuesday 6 June 2006 stated that the Tasmanian Government and TT-Line had expressed concerns regarding the long term future of the existing Melbourne to Devonport service. One option is to increase fares to offset rising costs. (Steven Haby)
