





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News

Timetables in the NSW election

At the recent NSW election, timetables became a campaign item. The NSW Opposition, although widely criticized for a piecemeal transport policy, had, as 3 of its 4 planks in its Public Transport platform, the following:

• Immediately conduct a full review of the CityRail timetable to prioritize the urgent introduction of additional peak and express services on the CityRail network.

New express services to be introduced as part of the timetable review will include services to/from Sydney and the Central Coast, Blue Mountains, South Coast, Penrith, Campbelltown and Cronulla.

• Restore truth in timetables by **scrapping Labor's definition of** ¹**on-time running'** for trains, buses and ferries. A service will only be considered **'on time' if it arrives within the minute** it **is scheduled to arrive~**

Interim Kuranda Scenic Railway excursion services begin

QR will commence short excursion train trips from Kuranda to Barron Falls tomorrow (March 27), as an interim service while works continue to ensure the line is safe for the commencement of normal schedules.

Phil Reeves, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Transport said many visitors to Tropical North Queensland had been disappointed on missing the historic and spectacular Kuranda Scenic Railway journey.

"These short excursions will give our guests a sample of the regular experience and the opportunity to take in one of the highlights of the trip, the Barron Falls Gorge. This will go a small way towards filling a gap in a visit to the region," Mr. Reeves said.

"This interim service will provide a slice of the usual tourist experience and I am sure inject some much appreciated income into the local economy."

The thirty minute excursions will depart daily, on the hour from Kuranda Station beginning at 11am through to 3pm. Kuranda Scenic Railway carriages and locomotives will be used to transport the passengers.

Member for Barron River Steve Wettenhall said the services were good news for tourists and businesses alike.

"The Kuranda Rail is a tourist icon for the region and some business operators in Kuranda that rely on trade generated by the scenic railway have told me that the closure of the service has had a significant impact on their bottom line," Mr. Wettenhall said.

"I've been listening to the concerns of Kuranda businesses and I know they are very pleased that this short but scenic trip will put a rail experience back on the menu for visitors to the region so I too am delighted that the interim service will be up and running this week."

"This will be a fun trip for Kuranda visitors and the thirty minute round-trip to Barron Falls will still leave ample time in most schedules for people to enjoy the attractions in the village"

The round-trip fare will be only \$10 for adults and \$5 for children. Tickets can be purchased at Kuranda Station or by calling Kuranda Scenic Railway on 4036 9333.

QR's North Queensland Manager Traveltrain, Mr. Gary Young said repair and construction work on the line was progressing well and the construction of the rock fall mesh fence was underway.

When the rock fall fence is completed, the construction on the tunnel can safely commence. Tunnel construction will be interrupted for safety reasons as trains pass through, so only one daily service will operate each way between Kuranda and Cairns.

"While this is less than our normal service level, the single train is expected to meet the demand at that time of the year," Mr. Young said.

The service is limited so a 40 metre long tunnel can be constructed at the site as quickly as possible as a long term solution to the slippage problem. It is expected that this tunnel will be completed in time for the peak season around mid year. The normal two daily services in each direction will then resume.

ARTC-NSW issued Version 3 of its 8-Oct-2006 SWTT on 6-Nov-2006, to become effective on 26-Nov-2006. A version 4 was foreshadowed, but it never materialized. Under normal circumstances a new timetable would be expected soon, to take effect on 25th March.

ARTC-National did not issue its normal "Spring" edition of its WTT, expected in September/October.

In late March, **CityRai**l issued version 4.0 of its 28-May-2006 WTT- Books 1, 2 & 3. These replace Version 2 of September 2006. There was apparently no Version 3 issued. The new books are mostly updated reprints, incorporating changes notified in STNs, although not all of them.(G. Lambert)

Victoria

Pacific National Network Access (still the Victorian track owner and operator) issued new passenger Network Service Plans (WTTs) for all lines on 11th March, back-dated to be effective from 4th March. Since the last issue, various amended versions of the "Network Operating Requirements" and "Addenda" sections of the NSP were issued between October and March. The NSP+NOR+Addenda is available in the April AATTC Distribution list as an omnibus volume.

Super Saturday Races at Caulfield: 10 March 2007

Connex was to run extra trains to Flinders Street, Dandenong and Frankston after the Super Saturday race meeting at Caulfield on Saturday, 10 March 2007. The last race was scheduled to be run at 5.15pm.

- For racegoers returning to the city, there will be special trains, running express from Caulfield to South Yarra then stopping at Richmond and terminating at Flinders Street. These trains will leave Caulfield on platform 1 at 4.29pm, 4.49pm, 5.13pm, 5.29pm, 5.55pm, 6.13pm, 6.32pm, 6.52pm and 7.11pm. Journey time for these trains to Flinders Street is approximately 12 minutes.
- Trains stopping all stations to Flinders Street, depart Caulfield on platform 1 every 20 minutes from 3.41pm until 7.21pm.
- Trains from Frankston, stopping at Malvern and then running express to South Yarra, depart Caulfield on platform 1 every 20 minutes from 4.16pm until 7.16pm.
- In addition to the normal Saturday timetable, there will be an extra train to Frankston departing Caulfield on platform 2 at 5.48pm.
- There will also be an extra train to Dandenong, departing Caulfield on platform 3 at 5.59pm. This train will stop at all stations from Caulfield to Dandenong.

Avalon Airshow 2007

A busy weekend for the Geelong Line. Timings for the specials were quite slow for some trips. Normal Vlocity schedules to Lara are 35 minutes for semi-express; the specials were allowed 39 - 45 minutes. Similarly N class hauled, normally 42 minutes; the specials 43 - 55 minutes. New South Wales

Sydney Buses. On 4th March, Sydney Buses introduced a new Manly to Wynyard Express Bus service, the E70. In preparation for the service, Brookvale Depot ran an extensive advertising blitz including newspaper advertisements, free-standing posters at bus stops, signs on the T3 Clearway warning motorists of fines for infringements, and a double-decker bus parked daily at the foot of the Spit Hill, with a similar message. Fourteen services are provided between 5:59 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. out of Manly and fourteen from Wynyard between 3:45 p.m. and 7:03 p.m. Running time is about 30 minutes, competitive with the ferries. The inbound service is advertised as all stops to Seaforth, thence Express, but it also picks up at Spit, Cremorne and Neutral Bay Junctions. On the return trip, the E70 runs Express to Awaba Rd, thence all stops. The service is well patronized. Buses are provided by Brookvale Depot, but are rather old Mercedes. A single-page A4 B&W timetable was issued to shops along the route. Sydney Buses

The new E70 route began 5 March. This is a peak hour service between Gilbert Park, Manly Wharf and Wynyard. It operates city bound during the morning peak and the reverse during the afternoon peak. As a result the E79 (War Veterans' Home, Collaroy Plateau to City) will be diverted to use the Burnt Creek Motorway, although route 179 will continue to use Condamine Street and Sydney Road. Trips of E68 (North Balgowlah/Warringah Mall to City) which terminate at Kitchener and Wanganella Streets, Nth Balgowlah, to Balgowlah Road and Condamine Street. There is also a reduction in the number of route 175 Wynyard-Warringah Mall journeys.

Timetable for this service has been noted on the Sydney Buses website as have new timetables for Warringah and Cromer Districts all dated 5/3/2007.

The 352 separate timetable has been eliminated, and is now incorporated into the Swansea timetable.

There was never an official separate 353 timetable.

The Nightowl timetable has also been eliminated, with all Nightowl trips being incorporated into their relevant timetables."

However Len Regan further advises that although the 352 and Nightowl timetables are no longer officially on issue, Newcastle Buses continue to issue these timetables while stock last and as such should until further notice be retained in the timetables list.

Ferry and Shipping

Sydney Ferries.

In early December, with the re-commissioning of the Manly Jetcat wharf, a normal Manly service resumed. The interim August 2006 timetable (itself a replacement for a July 2006 version with errors) was withdrawn and the previous permanent timetable again appeared in the timetable racks. This version was, however, undated, but was in circulation until early March, when a dated version replaced it. Both versions are available from the AATTC Distribution List.

Sydney Ferries issued a Media Release in December, claiming an increase in reliability to 99.5%, but it transpired that this number related only to outbound services departing Circular Quay within 5 minutes of schedule, with arrivals, return journeys, altered, cancelled and replaced services, not being admitted to the count. A Freedom of Information request by the State Opposition at the time revealed that vessel availability had averaged only 76% in the previous Financial Year. The Freshwater, in particular, broke down regularly in November/December, being described by Circular Quay wharf staff as "as sick as a dog", although this is probably not a nautical term.

The Freshwater class boat "Queenscliff" returned from its refit in Newcastle just before Christmas, enabling Sydney Ferries to re-institute a 4-boat 20-minute interval service to Manly for December/January. Sydney Ferries issued wall sheet timetables and DL-sized leaflets for the summer service and also for special services on Boxing Day and New Year's Eve. However, by frank admission of Sydney Ferries staff, all of these timetables were riddled with errors and had to be withdrawn. Replacement DL-sized B&W leaflets for the Manly service were available on 27-December, being handed out by wharf staff to passengers, along with a colour brochure giving summary details of all Sydney Ferries services over Christmas/New Year and into January. Both these TTs were available in the January AATTC Distribution List.

Sydney Ferries also issued special cruise timetables for the visit of the Queen Mary and Queen Elizabeth 2 in late February. The simultaneous visit of these two big ships caused massive transport dislocations in Sydney. All regular ferry services became overloaded, some were cancelled and others departed as soon as they became filled. This occurrence engendered severe criticism and Sydney Ferries apologized publicly. For the 75th anniversary of the Sydney Harbour Bridge, special cruises were again organised and timetable brochures produced. All these special timetables are available from AATTC.

The Manly service continues to be disrupted by inexplicable cancellations of services, particularly the early morning services. Passengers are usually accommodated on Jetcats. (G. Lambert)
